Dredging Project Completed

As most of you know our dredging project has been completed. Below you will find summaries of the project results and expenses that have been prepared by Andy Messer, Chairman of the Dredging Committee. The project kicked off in 2005 with commencement of the permitting process. Our community owes an immense debt of gratitude to Andy and his committee for their years of perseverance and patience in overseeing this nine year project – THANK YOU ANDY! Andy has provided some wonderful dredging survey maps that have been posted on the LPCA website showing the silting basin before and after as well as a current jetty channel chart.

Andy's summary of expenses also includes the allocation of dredging expenses between all LPCA lot owners and Divisions 2, 3 & 4 as agreed under the Memorandum of Agreement between LPCA and the Architectural Committee of LPCA Divisions 2, 3 & 4 dated November 23, 2009 and revised and amended on May 11, 2010.

Dredging expenses to date total \$624,696, of which all LPCA lot owners have paid \$334,000 and Division 2, 3 & 4 lot owners have paid an additional \$290,696. All expenses incurred to date have been paid without the need to take out a loan. Dredging assessments collected from all LPCA lot owners (not including additional amounts paid by Division 2, 3 and 4 that were deposited into the Division 2, 3 & 4 Waterway Fund) through 2012 total \$345,753. We are still in the process of collecting the dredging assessments due from all LPCA lot owners that were due Oct. 31st, 2013. Payment of the invoice sent by Vicki Powers (LPCA Treasurer) for the dredging special assessment that was due on October 31, 2013 is the last and final payment of the dredging assessment that has been paid annually by all LPCA lot owners since 2008!

The dredging permit from Island County requires LPCA to perform annual eel grass surveys for five years starting in 2014 and submit a summary of each annual survey to Island County for their review. All dredging assessments paid by all LPCA lot owners that are in excess of dredging expenses paid to date will be held in reserve to cover the annual eel grass surveys and any related actions required by Island County. A proposal of what to do with any excess dredging amounts remaining at the end of this five year period will be submitted by the LPCA Board to homeowners for approval.

Dredging Summary Andy Messer

Beach Lot Owners:

The dredged material has been placed on the beach and shaped to the intended grade <u>as specified in our dredging permit</u>. The volume of material was less than originally estimated and the volume required on the beach just south of the jetty was much greater than anticipated. No material remained to be placed on the Division One beaches. Future changes in the beach due to tides, wave action or other acts of nature will continue as they have throughout the history of Lagoon Point.

Boaters:


Navigation in our Waterways is open and "Heron Island" is gone!

The depth of the main canal and the north ends of the East and West canals is 10 feet below MLLW. Note that the <u>Jetty Channel</u> and the <u>northern part of the Lot C waterway</u>, from the boat ramp to the bridge out about 25 yards south of the old bulkhead, were not included in the permitted dredge plan.

Caution:

The depth at the east end of the jetty channel remains at minus one foot MLLW to control the minimum low tide level in our canals. However, the sandbar at the west end of the jetty channel remains a hazard. I will take some time for the "self-flushing" action and low tides to change that; however, this is also subject to the whims of wind and tide.

It is still recommended that at least 2 feet be added to your lowest "safe passage" tide level, until the sandbar is flushed out.



Note: Historically the low tide level in our canals stopped at about 0 feet MLLW during minus tides. Recently our lowest tide level had been more than a foot higher, due to blockages in our waterways. Now that dredging is complete, the free flow of water out of our canals at low tide will be restored. We anticipate that the lowest tide level within our canal system will be noticeably lower at zero and minus tides, as the "self-flushing" action of the jetty channel returns to its "normal" condition.

Determine your boat's Safe Passage tide level:

Draft is the depth of the lowest part of your boat, including keel, prop and rudder. Add one or two feet for safe clearance. Use that as your initial Safe Passage tide level. There is a "Tide Board" on the southern piling of the boat launch dock. Observe your depth finder as you transit the jetty channel. If you are new to Lagoon Point or have not transited the jetty channel for some time, observe the jetty channel at low tide from the parking lot. Adjust your boat's Safe Passage tide level, as experience and changing conditions dictate.

Why did we not dredge the jetty channel?

Our jetty channel is "self-flushing". It reaches a natural state due to the outflow from the canals during ebb tide. If the channel was deeper, the low water in the canals would be as much as 3 feet lower and most of the docks would have to be repositioned to prevent grounding and gangways lengthened to reach the docks at the lowest tides. Also, the area west of the jetty entrance develops sand bars that would defeat the effort. Any dredging of the sand bars at the west end of the jetty will be erased by the next

storm. If the channel was widened, the outflow would be slower and the

channel would silt in.

To truly give us a "deep water" access, the jetty would have to be extended out to the minus 10 foot contour or more. The channel would have to be wider due to the slope of the jetty walls. Cost for all of that including modifications to docks and gangways would be quite high. It is not likely a permit could be obtained for such a jetty even if we were willing to fund the project.

Slow down to the pace of the Island.

Plan your boating activities around the tides. Try not to run aground, it spoils your day.

Lagoon Point Dredging Project ~ Cost Report November 2013 by Andrew Messer

Our dredging project began in September 2005 following a vote of the lot owners approving funding. Work began with surveys and studies, followed by planning and preparation of documents for permit submission. Many requirements and options were involved and had to be coordinated with Island County Planning, Washington State Department of Fisheries and Wildlife, Department of Ecology, Department of Natural Resources and the Army Corps of Engineers. Contractors and consultants were also required for preparation of the permit and execution of the project.

By agreement between the Lagoon Point Community Association (LPCA) Board of Directors and the Division 2, 3 & 4 Architectural Committee, the cost of the dredging project was divided into two parts. One part was paid by all 416 lots in Lagoon Point and View Tracts, including the canal lot owners. The other part was paid exclusively by the 150 Division 2, 3 & 4 Canal lot owners from their Special Waterway Fund. The costs were allocated as follows: All permit related costs, including pre-dredge surveys were split 50/50. All eelgrass mitigation was split by the area affected. The area on Lot C was paid by LPCA (all lot owners) and the area in the Division 2, 3 & 4 canals was paid by the Canal lot owners (D234). The actual dredging was paid by the volume of material removed. The volume removed from Lot C was paid by LPCA (all lot owners) and the volume removed from the Division 2, 3 & 4 canals was paid by the Canal lot owners (D234). The mobilization of the dredging equipment and crew was split 50/50. The following tables summarize the costs:
