WDFW Green Crab Trapping


Recently European Green Crab (EGC) have been detected in Lagoon Point. From August 20-21st Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife trapping crews set a total of 66 traps in Lagoon Lake over 1 night. The result of this effort was 4 EGC: 3 females, 1male.

WDFW returned on September 11-13th to continue trapping efforts within the canals. Over 40 canal property owners responded to the DFW and allowed access to their properties and docks. The traps were checked daily. Over the 3 days of trapping, there were no European Green Crabs were caught in the canals. It is likely that the DFW will make another request next spring when the crabs are more active.

The European green crab (Carcinus maenas) is a globally damaging invasive species that poses a threat to native shellfish, eelgrass, and estuary habitat critical for salmon and many other species.

In areas where EGC have been able to establish large populations for extended periods of time, they have had dramatic impacts on other species, particularly smaller shore crabs, clams, and small oysters. While green crabs cannot crack the shell of a mature oyster, they can prey upon young oysters, and will dig down six inches to find clams to eat. One green crab can consume 40 half-inch clams a day, as well as other crabs its own size. Their digging can have significant negative impacts on eelgrass, estuary and marsh habitats.

The most distinctive feature is not its color – which can vary from reddish to a dark mottled green – but the five spines or teeth on each side of the shell. There are three rounded lobes between the eyes; and the last pair of legs are somewhat flattened. The carapace is broader than it is long and seldom exceeds 4 inches across.



EGC can be reported at European green crab identification and reporting | Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife, on the Washington Invasive Species Council app, or via phone at 1-888-WDFW-AIS (1-888-933-9247).

The presence of these invasive species may have an impact on our waterway projects in the future. Let's all continue to do our part to assist the DFW in their effort to control the spread of these aliens.

Waterway Project Update:

The reports and permit applications for the overall project are awaiting some further clarification before submittal. The Waterway Committee has been working with MSA (Marine Surveys and Assessments) to discuss the potential for beach nourishment with the tideland owners south of the jetty canal. The site location of the removed dredge material is one of the outstanding items to be addressed in our permit applications. Where the dredge material goes also has an impact on the construction methods and our final costs.

Another precursor to the final permit applications for the combined waterway projects is to determine the characteristics of the sediment in the siltation basin. The Jarpa (Joint Aquatic Resources Permit Application) for the sediment coring has been approved by the Army Corps of Engineers. WDFW approval is the last piece we are waiting on for the coring in the siltation basin to be scheduled.

We are working towards having cost estimates for the three different aspects of our project. The shoreline bulkhead restoration, the maintenance dredge of the siltation basin and the replacement of the Lot C floating dock. A fully defined plan and cost estimates will help us to have enough information for LPCA members to vote upon the construction on their ballot. I am hopeful this will happen next spring.

As we go through the old files to try and gather information from the past dredges we have found a number of reports, communications and presentations by Andy Messer. He left a wealth of paperwork and files to document the effort that the committee and the community went through on the previous dredge project. Please read the notice below from his wife Rita.

Remembering Andrew (Andy) Clark Messer: 1942 – 2024

With profound sadness it is reported that Andy passed away Friday morning, August 9, 2024, after battling multiple myeloma cancer for 2 ½ years. He was 82 years old. Andy is survived by his wife Rita Luft of not quite 10 years, his stepdaughter Judy, stepson-in-law Gary, and step granddaughter Arianna of Lagoon Point, Whidbey Island. Andy was involved in Lagoon Point as President for two years, the Architectural Committee for 8 years and in the dredging project in the past. Andy was "Mr. Fix It" and his favorite pastime was his boat "Good Times." Andy will be deeply missed.

Services will be held Saturday, October 12 at 1:00pm at Trinity Lutheran Church, Freeland.

LPCA Website – Members Area Password
